SERVICE AWARDS

The MHS Board of Directors awarded the 2022 Exceptional Service Awards to Lisa Wessner of Manchester and the late Nancy H. Otis and Edwin L. Bigelow. Lisa was honored for her many invaluable contributions to MHS. As executor of her uncle Herb Wessner's estate, she worked closely with curator Shawn Harrington to bring the most valuable items in his collection to MHS. Lisa's expertise in information technology was critical to helping the society set up and maintain the computers and software necessary to fulfill its mission. She also served as secretary of the Board of Directors from 2016-2021. A 1990 graduate of Burr and Burton Seminary (now Academy), Lisa is the IT manager at r.k. Miles in Manchester.

Nancy H. Otis and Edwin L. Bigelow were honored for their long and dedicated service to the growth of the Manchester Historical Society during the 1950s and 60s and their authorship of the first complete history of Manchester. Conceived in February 1960, *Manchester Vermont 1761-1961 A Pleasant Land Among the Mountains* is the definitive history of Manchester up to 1961, the year it was published by the Town of Manchester.
