MHS IN THE COMMUNITY

While our faithful volunteers continued the work of cataloging the items in our collection every week, MHS gave numerous presentations throughout the community this past year. Board member Courtney Callo gave a very well-attended talk on what it was like growing up on Equinox Mountain (photo above).



On September 22 MHS invited the community to gather at Dellwood Cemetery for a Victorian-style picnic and an introduction to some of the illustrious people buried there. A barber shop quartet provided the entertainment.



MHS also partnered with local schools and nonprofits to share the stories of Manchester's history.

Our collaboration with Green Mountain Academy for Lifelong Learning continued this past year with several programs on local history. The videos of these talks can be viewed on our website www.manchesterhistoricalsocietyvt.org under Videos/GMALL.

At Burr and Burton Academy, learning about local history in Mr. Vincent's Photography class took the form of digitally coloring vintage photographs of the Equinox, supplied by MHS. The students' work was on display at the Equinox Resort throughout the spring and summer.

At the invitation of Social Studies teacher John Graf, Shawn gave a presentation on the *Women of Burr and Burton and Manchester* for Women's History Month in March.



Long Trail School invited Shawn to their all-school morning meeting three times for a flash history lesson on various topics including the Green Mountain Boys of the Northshire and an introduction to the MHS TravelStories app, the audio-visual tour of Manchester available online and on smartphones.

Shawn was invited to give anniversary addresses this year for three local and historic organizations. In July, he presented an historical perspective of the Manchester Music festival at its 50th anniversary gala held at the Manchester Community Library. In August and September, he gave a presentation to members of Ekwanok Country Club on the history of the club as part of the 125th anniversary celebration of its founding. Also in September, he was the keynote speaker at the Manchester Community Library's 10th anniversary celebration, giving a wide-ranging presentation on the founding of the Mark Skinner Library and how the library has evolved.



MHS has been actively engaged in plans for the 250th celebration of our nation's founding which will be celebrated across the country in 2026-2028. Shawn is a member of the Vermont 250th Committee, which has been meeting regularly. On August 17, MHS participated in a 250th Anniversary fund-raising gala held at the Equinox on Battle Day weekend, which was very successful and great fun.

MHS was honored to partner with Vermont Folklife and the Manchester Community Library for a listening party in November followed by a two-day workshop held at Burr and Burton on how to conduct oral histories that drew a good audience. The purpose of the listening party was to bring people together to share the experience of listening deeply by sharing voices, music, and songs from the archive at Vermont Folklife.

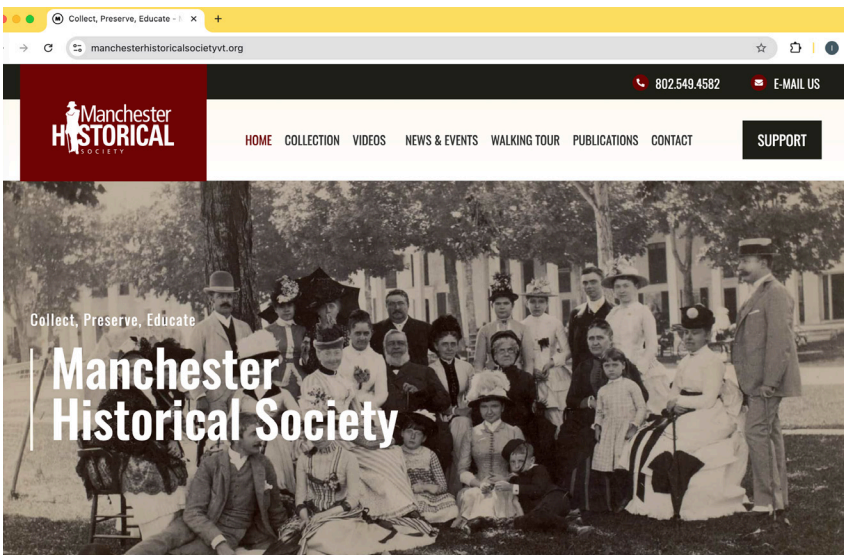


MHS was deeply honored to be a co-presenter last summer of Lyman Orton's "For the Love of Vermont" art exhibit with the Manchester Community Library. The show ran from June 14-September 7 and included 70 exceptional works of art reflecting aspects of Vermont life by numerous artists, many of them native to Vermont. Hundreds of visitors had the pleasure of viewing a part of Orton's collection not seen before.



Thanks to all our generous supporters, we were able to upgrade two important areas of our work, one practical and the other technical.

For the first time in ten years, we have been able to replace our aging office equipment and temporary worktables with new permanent tables and comfortable office chairs.
